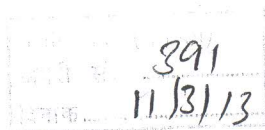


Sir,
