Additional Inputs on Permitting Trading of Spectrum in India

Mobile spectrum is indeed finite. But **spectrum is sufficient. Spectrum is not scarce**. Spectrum deployment in sufficiency is indeed crucial for national productivity. Equally, it is the policy premise upon which the telecom sector moved from a command-and-control to a market based mode. It is **India uniquely** which, contrary to avowed policy, **has converted**

spectrum sufficiency into scarcity. This has been achieved through the

1. **Physical capture of Spectrum**. Traditionally through just holding back spectrum, lately

also through sky-high reserve prices.

2. Misallocation of Spectrum. Even some of the insufficient allocated spectrum is either

underused or unused, aided by an indulgent spectrum usage charging regime.

3. Strangling of Spectrum. Fanciful labels like un-liberalized spectrum, about-turns on

Intra-Circle-Roaming, impossible M&A dispensations, all contribute to contrived

scarcity. Opposition to Spectrum Trading is but a part of this syndrome.

Our nation is in an economic crisis. A feature has been the retreat from policies based on

principles, to policies of contrived scarcities which suit only license raj warriors. The

Authority may please recommend spectrum trading, because of inherent merit, as also

to move the sector away from a command-and-control to a market-based dispensation.
