





Joint Response of APSCC, ESOA and GVF to the Consultation Paper issued by the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India on

Uplinking and Downlinking of Television Channels in India (No. 16/2017)

The Asia-Pacific Satellite Communications Council (APSCC), the EMEA Satellite Operators' Association (ESOA), and the Global VSAT Forum (GVF) welcome the opportunity to provide responses to the Consultation Paper issued by the Telecom Regulatory Authority of India (TRAI) on Uplinking and Downlinking of Television Channels in India (the "Consultation").¹

APSCC is a non-profit international association representing all sectors of satellite and/or space-related industries, including private and public companies, government ministries and agencies, and academic and research entities. The overall objective of APSCC is to promote communications and broadcasting via satellite as well as outer space activities in the Asia-Pacific for the socioeconomic and cultural welfare of the region.²

ESOA is the world's only CEO-driven satellite association, and leads a coordinated and impactful response to the global challenges and opportunities the commercial satellite communications sector faces. Established as a non-profit organization, ESOA has as its objective to promote the common interests of satellite operators. Today ESOA represents the interests of EMEA satellite operators who deliver information communication services across the globe.³
