Hello Sir,

I came across the consultation paper with the title stated in the title.

What came shocking to me was the reply filled by Bharti Airtel, one of the so called stakeholder.

In the reply the Bharti Airtel is proposing to limit the speeds to 64kbps after a customer has exhausted its Fair Usage Share (FUG). Reason for same is given as misuse of the current 512kbps.

Now let me get things into perspective,  
An hour long youtube video in SD 480p format is usually **400MB** in size.  
At **512 kbps** it takes around **01:54:35** hours to load.  
If things proposed by Bharti Airtel is implemented it will take **15:16:40** hours to load at **65kbps**.

A 2 hour movie will takes almost 6.5 hours at 512kbps, it will take **53:28:20** hours at **64kbps**.

This will be a huge step backwards.

This is the same company that promotes downloading of movies on its 4G network which is again heavily charged.

There are two reasons that i can think of that the company wants TRAI to further downgrade its definition.

2. It wants to milk the cow further by charging more for every bit of data.
